Encelía sp.	Brittlebush, Coast Sunflower	Sub-shrub	Seeds eaten
Heteromeles arbutifolia	Toyon	Large Shrub/Tree	Berries eaten, good winter food source
Lonicera subspicata	Chaparral Honeysuckle	Climbing	Berries eaten
Malosma laurina	Laurel Sumac	Large Shrub	Fruits eaten, good nesting and cover
Prunus ilicifolia	Hollyleaf Cherry	Tree	Fruits eaten
Quercus sp.	Oaks	Tree	Acorns eaten, provides excellent foraging
