Low-maintenance

Garden looks the way you want it to...
with the amount of work you want to do...
without being wasteful.



Traditional Turf-dominated Landscapes

Are not low-maintenance.

- Just because someone else is doing the work doesn't make it easy or low-maintenance.
- High resource input: water, fuel, noise, labor, money, pesticides, etc.
- Maintenance is same all year around. Complete dominance over nature.



Care not Maintenance

- **Maintenance** implies domination over nature.
- **Caring** for your garden means working with nature:
 - Understand your yard and the plants in it.
 - Do different things at different times of the year.



11 Tips for Success

1. Take your gardening hints from nature.
2. Select plants that are compatible with your garden conditions and practices.
3. Group plants with similar requirements.
4. Don't crowd your plants. Choose plants that will fit their space when they are mature.
5. Select low-maintenance plants that don't accumulate dead stuff, don't need to be removed (annuals), don't need to be watered all of the time (containers).



11 Tips for Success

6. Time your maintenance well.
7. Less water and fertilizer mean less weeds.
8. Try to disturb the soil as little as possible.
9. Mulch is your friend.
10. Remove the plant if it takes too much work.
11. RELAX AND ENJOY YOUR GARDEN!

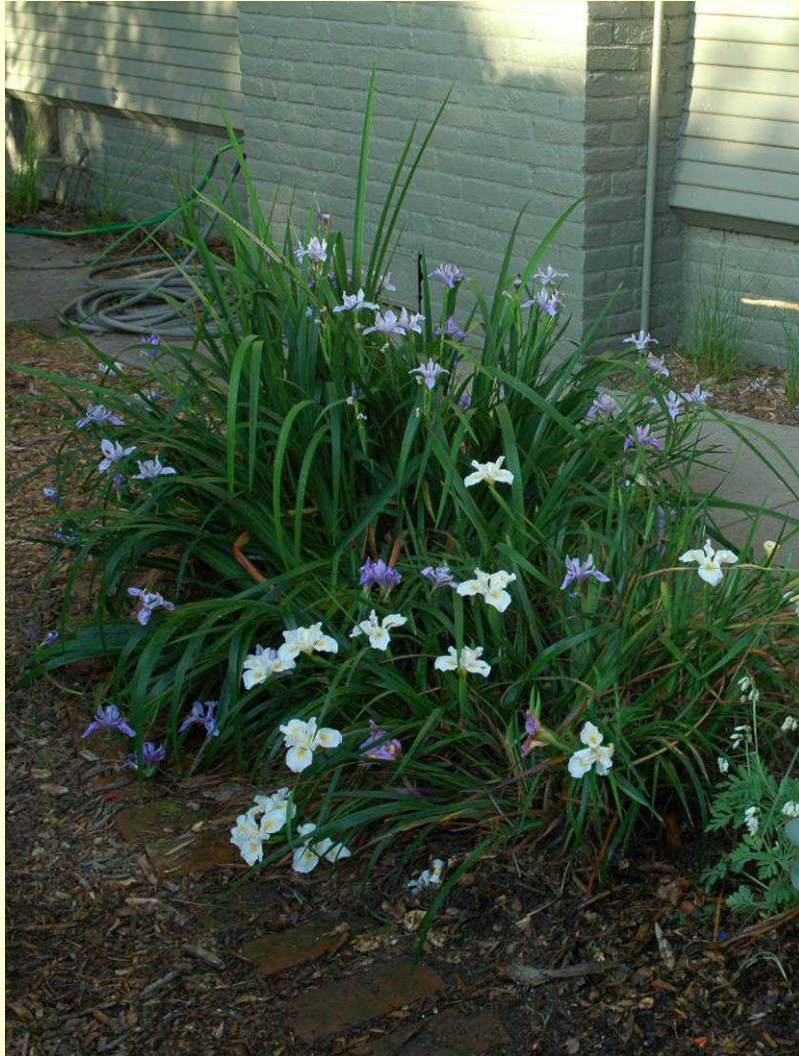
